Context

The Kindia region is home to major ecosystems for Guinean biodiversity: future national parks of Kounounkan, Méla Koré, Konkouré Delta, and Mount Gangan, mangrove areas, strategic rivers, and agricultural areas connected to the Fouta Djallon massif. However, slash-and-burn agriculture, unsustainable logging, charcoal burning, artisanal mining, and land pressure are fragmenting habitats, degrading soils, and increasing communities' vulnerability to climate change.



Objectives

- Strengthening the economic and social resilience of villages bordering national parks.
- Supporting more than 42,000 farmers towards agroecological practices, sustainable sectors and green entrepreneurship.
- Reducing the pressures related to agricultural, mining and forestry activities on ecosystems.
- Restoring, reforesting and improving the management of about 685,000 ha of sensitive ecosystems.
- Strengthening inclusive territorial governance through multi-stakeholder platforms and local committees.
